2. PDF Tools

- **Adobe Acrobat**
 - Products: Adobe Reader, Adobe Acrobat Standard, Adobe Acrobat Pro, Adobe Acrobat Pro 9 Extended / Adobe Acrobat X Suite
 - Product comparison: www.adobe.com/products/acrobat/matrix.html
 - Latest version: Adobe Reader/Acrobat X (10)
 - (In)compatibility with earlier versions
- **Other “Comparable” non-Adobe Products**

 - Verify compatibility with Acrobat features

3. Editing and Commenting PDF Files

- Using Commenting Tools in a normal document review cycle – don’t use only sticky note comments
 - Available in **Reader ver. 9** only if the PDF file author has enabled them using Adobe Acrobat Pro:
 - **Acrobat ver. 9:** Advanced > Extend Features in Adobe Reader
 - **Acrobat ver. X:** File > Save As > Reader Extended PDF > Enable Commenting In Adobe Reader
 - Commenting with highlighter and sticky notes available in **Reader ver. X** without the need to enable them; other commenting tools require enabling
- Comment & Markup tools
 - ver. 9:** Tools > Comment & Markup / Tools > Customize Toolbars / View > Toolbars > Comment & Markup [see **Figure 2**]

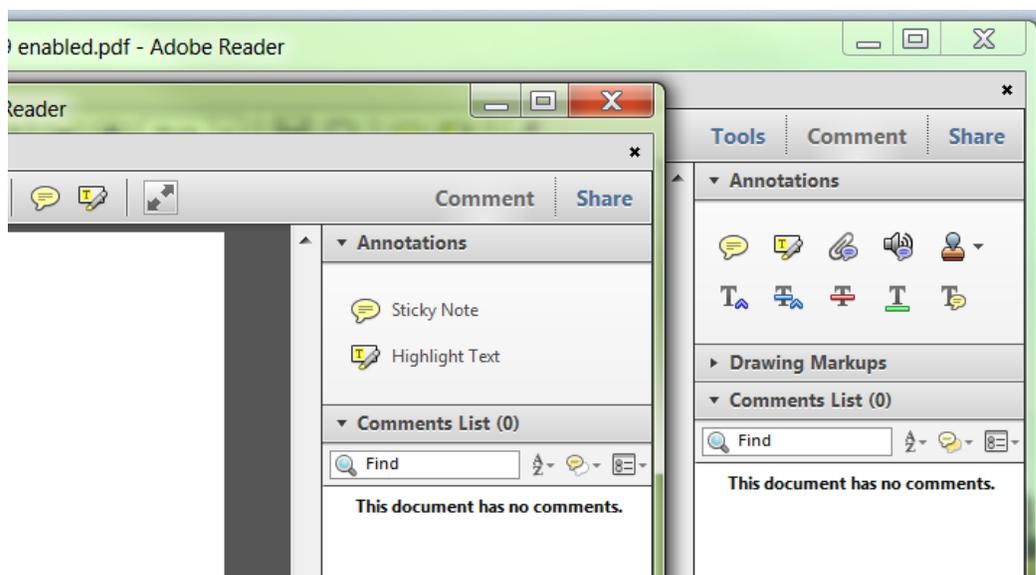


Figure 1. Comparison of the available commenting tools in Adobe Reader X (normal document on the left and an enabled document on the right).

 - ver. X:** Tools/Comment in the right-side pane [see **Figure 1**]
 - Text Edits, Highlight Text, Callout, Arrow, Rectangle, etc.
 - Show/Hide Comments
 - Show/Hide Comments List [see **Figures 3 and 4**]
 - Spell checking: Edit > Check Spelling > In Comments...

- Settings: Edit > Preferences > Spelling
 - Exporting comments as an FDF (Form Data Format) file:
 - ver. 9:** Document > Comments > Export Comments to Data File
 - ver X:** Comments List > Options > Export to Data File
 - Printing Comments: File > Print > Comments and Forms > Document and Markups (or Document and Stamps) [see **Figure 4**]
 - Identity setup: Edit > Preferences > Identity
- Typewriter tool (= “Add Or Edit Text Box” tool)
 - Available in Reader only if the PDF author has enabled it using Adobe Acrobat Pro:
 - **Acrobat ver. 9:** Tools > Typewriter > Enable Typewriter Tool in Adobe Reader *or* Advanced > Extend Features in Adobe Reader
 - **Acrobat ver. X:** File > Save As > Reader Extended PDF > Enable Adding Text in Documents
- Summarizing Comments: Comments > Summarize Comments – only in Acrobat
- Touching up text (changing text and text properties) – only in Acrobat
 - Tools > Advanced Editing / Advanced Editing toolbar
 - TouchUp Text Tool
 - Crop (also Document > Crop Pages)
 - **Acrobat ver. X:** Tools > Content > Edit Document Text
- Inserting/extracting/rearranging pages – only in Acrobat
 - Document > Insert/Extract/Replace/Delete Pages, or use the Pages navigation pane on the left
 - **Acrobat ver. X:** Tools > Pages >... (or use the Page Thumbnails panel of the navigation pane)
- E-mail-based review or shared review (on acrobat.com) for multi-party reviews

4. Searching for Text in PDF Files

- Edit > Find: text within the current document
- Edit > (Advanced) Search: text in one or more files [see **Figure 5**]
 - Basic Search Options
 - Advanced Search Options
- Indexing (only in Acrobat): possibility to index hundreds of files for quick searching
 - Select Advanced > Document Processing > Full Text Index with Catalog > New Index
 - Name the index, select directories to be included, click Build and specify location for the index file
 - Use the resulting .pdx file for searching
 - **Acrobat ver. X:** Tools > Document Processing > Full Text Index With Catalog > New Index
- Creating a Searchable Image
 - With the image file open in Acrobat, select Document > OCR Text Recognition > Recognize Text Using OCR
 - This can also be done with scanned images: Document > Scan to PDF
 - **Acrobat ver. X:** Tools > Recognize Text > In This File (or In Multiple Files)

5. Viewing and Zooming PDF Files

- **ver. 9:** Tools > Select & Zoom > Marquee Zoom / Dynamic Zoom / Pan & Zoom Window/ Loupe Tool / Snapshot Tool [see **Figure 7**]
- **ver. X:** View > Zoom > Marquee Zoom / Dynamic Zoom / Pan & Zoom / Loupe Tool [see **Figure 6**]
- **ver. X:** Edit > Take a Snapshot

6. Creating and Filling Electronic Forms

- Simple filling with Typewriter tool
- Using text boxes
- Fillable forms (IRS W-9)
- Converting electronic files to forms using Form Wizard
- Blueberry PDF Form Filler; FREE application for filling in and printing PDF forms (www.bbconsult.co.uk/Resources/PDFFormFiller.aspx)
 - Note: deselect “Lock All Controls” button

7. Using Electronic Signatures

- Inserting a scanned signature
 - Copy and paste via clipboard (as a “stamp”)
- Creating and using a digital ID
 - **Creating a digital ID:** Advanced > Security Settings > Digital IDs > Add ID > “A new digital ID I want to create now” > Next > New PKCS#12 digital ID file > Next. Fill the information fields, as needed, click Next. Select location for the ID and define a password. Click Finish to return to the Security Settings dialog box. Click Close.
 - **Signing a PDF document: ver 9:** Advanced > Sign & Certify > Place Signature; **ver X:** Tools > Place Signature. Drag a rectangle where you want to place the signature. Choose a digital ID, type the password, choose appearance and click Sign.

8. PDF File Password Protection and Permission Control

- File > Properties > Security [see **Figure 8**]
- Unprotecting PDF files

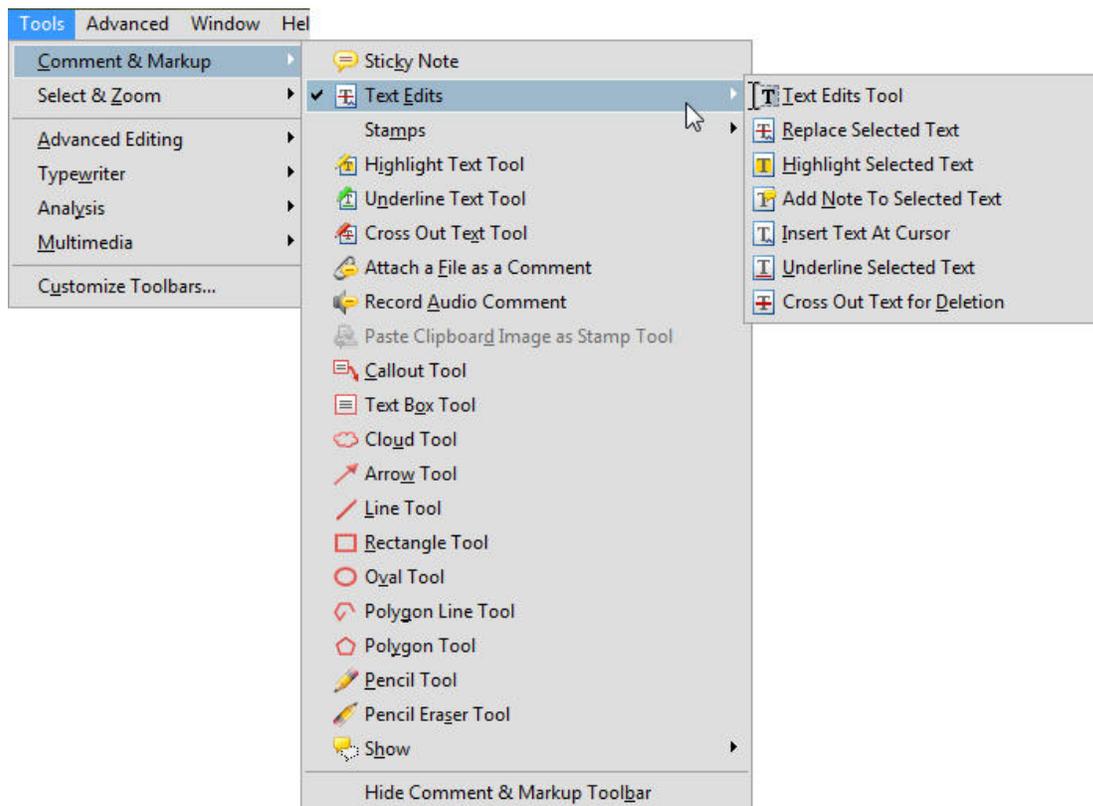


Figure 2. Adobe Acrobat Pro 9: Tools for commenting and markup.

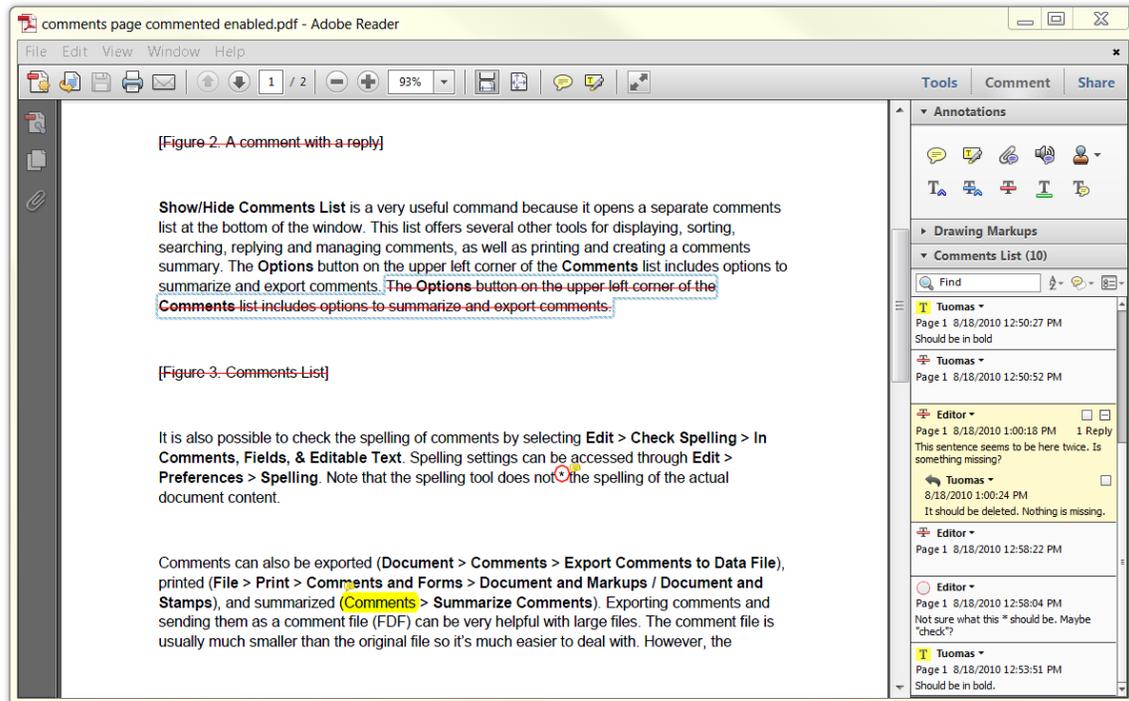


Figure 3. Adobe Reader X: Comments list open in the right-hand pane.

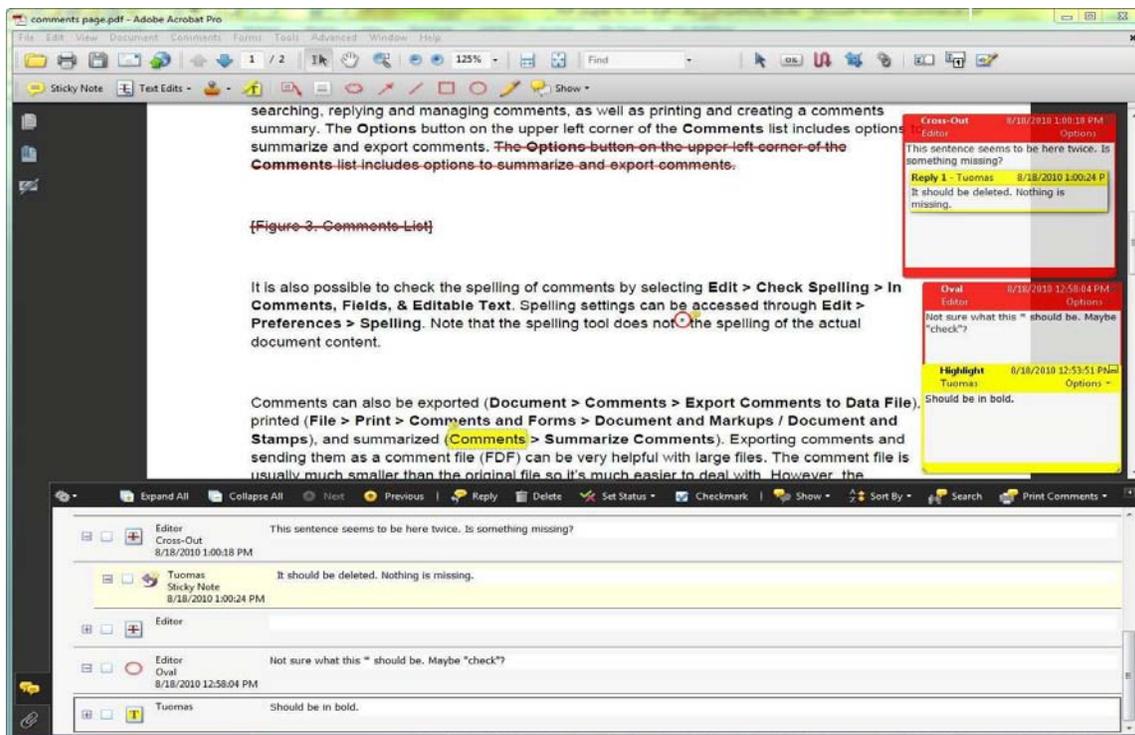


Figure 3. Adobe Acrobat Pro 9: Comments list open.

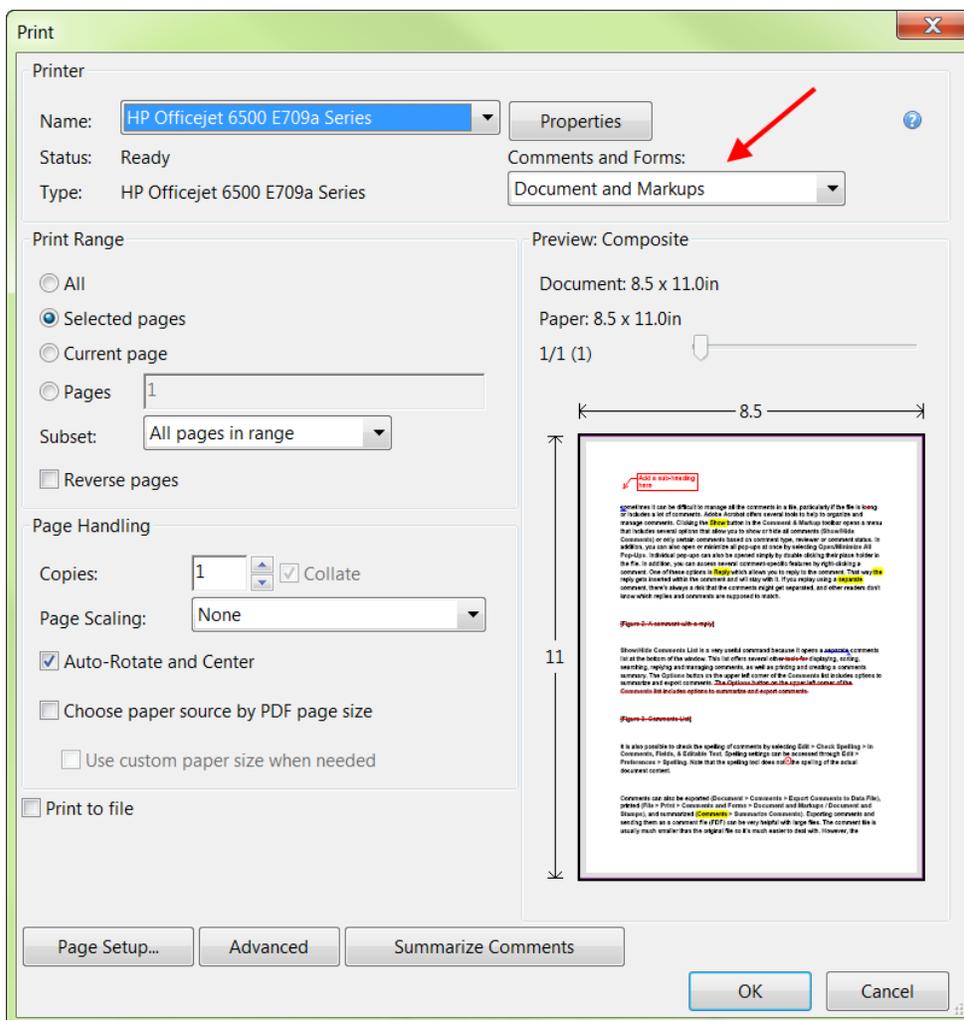


Figure 4. Adobe Reader/ Acrobat: Print settings dialog box. Note that “Markups” have been included for printing.

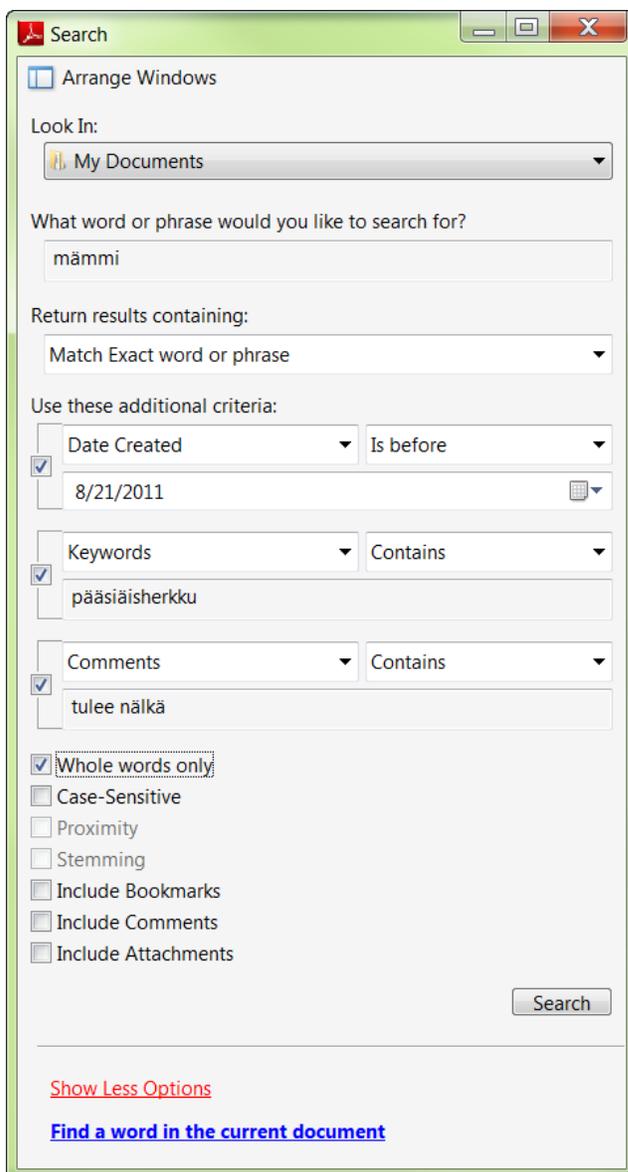


Figure 5. Adobe Reader/Acrobat X: Search window with advanced search options.

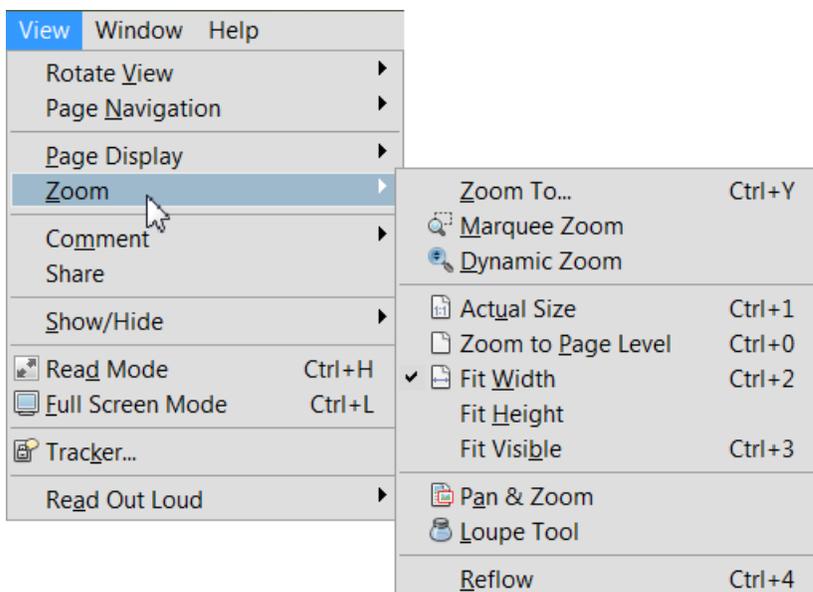


Figure 6. Adobe Reader/Acrobat X: Zooming options.

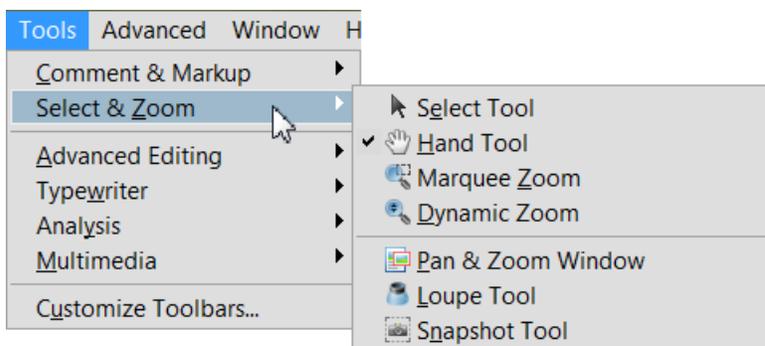


Figure 7. Adobe Reader/Acrobat 9: Zooming options.

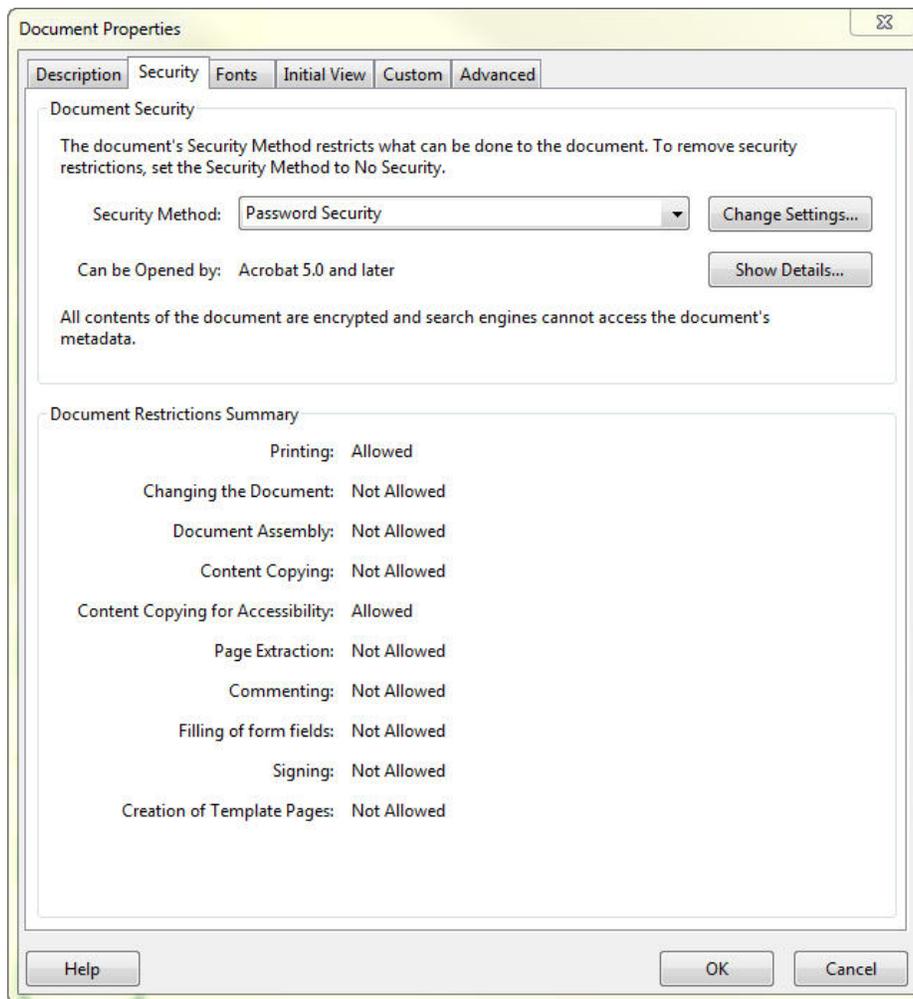


Figure 8. Adobe Acrobat Pro 9: Security Settings dialog box
